

Diving to Find Oysters Thriving



We recently went diving on our oyster reef project in front of St. Mary's College of Maryland. The tide was low, the water was clear,

and weather conditions were favorable allowing for successful underwater photography. We were excited to observe an abundance of aquatic life, including the blue crab pictured. We saw striped bass (rockfish) eels, and white perch. It is reaffirming to find such biodiversity, a positive indicator of the health of the area, as well as the health of the oyster reefs themselves. The oyster population of the reefs continues to expand, a particularly encouraging sign considering the erratic weather our region underwent this past winter. Despite some harsh and variable conditions with extreme low tides coinciding with well below freezing temperatures, our hardshelled friends were hard at work filtering an increasing volume of water as they grow in size and number.

The growth and health of oysters is being studied by Dr. Laura Eierman, among others, who joined us on the dive. Laura collected samples of oysters attached to plastic and will be analyzing the samples to determine whether the close proximity to plastic affects the genetic makeup and genetic expression of oysters. We are grateful for the opportunity to partner with researchers to improve scientific understanding of aquatic health, and we look forward to hearing the results of this research.
