At the US Oyster Festival on October 21-22, volunteers and staff collected 145 bushels of oyster shells. These shells will be the foundation of our 2024 oyster restoration efforts. We also gave away 50 native River Birch saplings to festival

goers. While most attendees were savoring oysters for their taste, our oyster tank and display boards showcased oysters' ecological importance as natural water filters

and vital habitat for aquatic life.

On October 26th, we presented our remote water quality monitoring devices to 460 oyster professionals at the Chesapeake Oyster Science Symposium presented by the Chesapeake Oyster Alliance. You can read more about this project in our <u>February</u> and <u>July</u> newsletters



On October 28th, we brought conservation STEM to the St. Mary's County Public School STEAM Festival at the St. Mary's County Fairgrounds. Students participated in our annual St. Mary's River oyster reproduction survey by counting "spat" (baby oysters) that collected on our traps over the summer.

### **Oysters Return to Breton Bay**

On Saturday, September 30th, volunteers planted one million baby oysters, known as "spat", off of Lover's Point for the second annual "One Million Oysters for Breton Bay." The volunteers included Shore Thing Shellfish LLC, Bell Marine Services, Last Look Outfitters, and more than three dozen community members.



In 2017, the Friends of St. Clements Bay launched the

Lover's Point oyster restoration project in the Breton Bay shellfish sanctuary. With help from the St. Mary's River Watershed Association (SMRWA) and the Southern Maryland Recreational Fishing Organization, the Friends have planted more than three million oysters at Lover's Point.



At the event on Saturday, the Friends and SMRWA announced that for the first time in decades oyster reporduction was occuring in Breton Bay!
